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1. Background to Cap.340

#### Animals (Control of Experiments) Ordinance, Cap.340

- To provide for the control of experiments on living vertebrate animals
  - First enacted in 1963
  - Animal a living vertebrate animal
  - Experiment any experiment <u>performed on an animal</u> and calculated to give pain




# Restrictions on purpose of experiment

- Section 6(1) no licensee shall perform any experiment except
  - knowledge, or of any knowledge which will be useful for saving or prolonging life, or alleviating suffering, or for combating any disease whether of human beings, animals or plants;
  - b) for the purpose of testing any former discovery alleged to have been made for the advancement of such types of knowledge referred to in para (a);
  - c) by the order in writing of any judge or district judge in any case where such judge is satisfied that it is essential for the purpose of justice in a criminal case to make such experiment.

# To attain manual skill/ for illustration of lectures

- □ Section 4(1) -
  - Except under and in accordance with an <u>endorsement</u> made under section 8, no licensee shall perform any experiment <u>for the purpose of</u> <u>attaining manual skill</u>.
- $\square$  Section 5(1)
  - Except under and in accordance with a <u>teaching permit</u> issued under section 9, no licensee shall perform any experiment <u>for the</u> purpose of illustrating any lecture at any academic institution.



# Application procedures



# When filling the application form

#### **☑** Dos

- Read "Guide to Application" and "Notes and Sample Forms" before filling in the forms
- Include information specific to Cap.340:
  - procedures to be performed on living animals
  - procedures expected to cause pain to the animals
  - planned use of anaesthesia, analgesic and/or other pain relieving methods to prevent or minimise pain and suffering expected to cause
- Provide valid contact information for communication
- Check completeness of the information before submit

# When filling the application form

#### **☒** Don'ts

- Directly quote/ attach published research article
- Provide lengthy protocol, which is used for purposes other than
   Cap.340, therefore information is not specific to licence application
- Inclusion of details that is not within the scope of Cap.340, e.g. in vitro analyses
- Lacking the measures to be taken to minimise and/or prevent pain and suffering expected to cause to the animals
- Information provided in Form 1 not tally with that in the Annex, e.g. types of animals, sacrificing methods

Unnecessary or inappropriate information would prolong the processing time

## Requirement for renewal of licence

- If licensee wishes to:
  - Continue with the same
     experiment after the
     specified periods as stated
     in the existing licence
  - i.e. no change of
    - Type of experiment(s); AND
    - Purpose of experiment(s)

#### □ Licensee should:

- Check if the Type of experiment(s);
  AND Purpose of experiment(s) are the same as existing licence
- If <u>no change</u>, complete the application form, indicate renewal of licence and quote licence ref. no.
- Submit application at least TWO months before the expiry date of existing licence

Any change of Type of experiment(s) or Purpose of experiment(s)
 Require submission of a NEW application

## Requirement for variation of licence

- □ If there are:
  - changes or additions of place(s) where the experiment may be conducted
- Licensee should:
  - Not perform the experiment at the new place(s) right away
  - Inform DH in writing of the full address(es) of the proposed place(s)
  - Receive a revised licence superseding the existing one if approved
  - Perform the experiment at the new place(s) after receiving the revised licence

It will be a breach of the Ordinance to conduct the experiments at a place other than that specified in the relevant licence.

# Other proposed changes

- e.g. the type(s) of animals, experimental procedure(s)
   and method(s) used to sacrifice the animals
  - $\blacksquare$  Require submission of a **NEW** application

It will be a breach of the Ordinance to conduct the experiments not in accordance with the terms of the relevant licence.

Any person who is guilty of an offence under section 3 shall be liable on summary conviction to a <u>fine at level 1</u> (HK\$2,000) and to <u>imprisonment for 6 months</u>.

#### 2. Legal responsibilities of licensees

- 1) Keep records (Form 6)
- 2) Permit inspections
- 3) Render returns (Form 7)
- 4) Conduct experiment in accordance with terms of licence

# 1) Keep records (Form 6)

#### Statutory requirement:

- □ S11(1) of Cap.340 Every licensee shall keep, in such form as may be prescribed, records of all experiments performed by him.
- R4 of Cap.340A Every licensee shall keep up-to-date a book in the form as set out as Form 6 in the Schedule in which he shall record the particulars therein indicated of all experiments performed by him.


- Keep up-to-date records; and
- Record particulars of all experiments performed in the form as set out as Form 6.
- Records can be in hard-copy or electronic format, provided that:
  - all particulars as listed in Form 6 should be included; and
  - The information is accessible when inspection and to be usable for subsequent reference.

# 2) Permit inspections

#### Section 11-

- (2) Every licensee shall permit any medical or health officer authorized in writing by the Licensing Authority to **inspect any records** kept by him at any time between 8 am and 6 pm on any day other than a Sunday or public holiday.
- (3) Every licensee shall permit any person authorised in writing as aforesaid to enter and inspect, for the purpose of securing compliance with the provisions of the Ordinance, any place specified in such licensee's licence for the performance of experiments.

# 3) Render returns (Form 7)

- Statutory requirement:
  - S12(1) of Cap.340 Every licensee shall render to the Licensing Authority in such form and at such time as may be prescribed such returns as may be required in relation to any experiments performed by the licensee.
  - R5 of Cap.340A Every licensee shall render to the Director of Health on or before the 1st day of January each year a return in the form set out as Form 7 in the Schedule of all experiments performed by him during the preceding 12 months.


- Record particulars of experiments performed in the preceding 12 months in Form 7;
- Ensure Form 7 is accurately filled in and signed; and
- Jan each year on time.

# Penalty in relation to records and returns

- Any person who contravenes the provisions of:
  - section 11(1) (Duty to keep records) or
  - section 12 (Duty to render returns)

Shall be <u>guilty of an offence</u> and shall be liable on summary conviction to a <u>fine at level 1</u> (HK\$2,000) and to <u>imprisonment for 3 months.</u>

#### 4) Conduct experiment according to the terms of licence

- Statutory requirement:
  - Section 3(2) No licensee shall perform any experiment except in accordance with the terms of his licence and subject to the restrictions imposed by the Ordinance.

- Conduct experiment according to the terms and conditions specified in the licence:
  - type of experiment(s)
  - purposes of experiment
  - validity period; and
  - place of experiment.

# General penalty

- Any person who is guilty of an offence under
  - section 3 (performance of experiments only by licensees);
  - section 4 (performing experiments to attain manual skill);
  - section 5 (performance of experiments for illustration of lectures); or
  - section 6 (restrictions upon performance of experiments by licensee)

Shall be liable on summary conviction to a <u>fine at level 1</u> (HK\$2,000) and to <u>imprisonment for 6 months</u>.

#### 3. Administration and enforcement of Cap.340

- 1) Inspection conducted by DH
- 2) Monitor submission of returns
- 3) Enquiries or complaints

# 1) Inspections conducted by DH

- Conduct inspection according to s11 of Cap.340
- Assess the compliance of licensee to the licensing conditions
- $\square$  Scheduled and/or unannounced inspection visit
- During inspection, authorized officers will:
  - □ Check Form 6 kept by licensee:
    - Whether it is up-to-date;
    - Record all particulars of experiment performed; and
    - Information recorded tally with those on Form 7 (if applicable)
  - Check laboratory records in relation to the animal experiment
  - Inspect place(s) for conducting the experiment as specified in the licence.

## 2) Monitor submission of returns

- Receive and process Form 7
- DH will conduct inspection to inspect records kept by licensee
   who did not render return
- Law enforcement action will be initiated against licensees who
  - had conducted experiments; AND
  - **failed to render** duly completed return **on time** without further notice.



# 3) Enquiries or complaints

- Any act that may be in contravention of Cap.340 could be reported to the Police directly.
- Alternatively, information in relation to the possible contraventions could be provided to DH.
- If there is reasonable ground to suspect that there may be a contravention of Cap.340, the suspected case would be subject to further investigation or legal advice for prosecution.

Important points to note when collating applications and/or returns for staff/ students

# Important points to note

- Submit on time:
  - Allow sufficient time for collating the applications/ returns so that forms are submitted on time according to the requirement.
- □ Review:
  - Check and ensure all the forms are already attached and submitted and nothing is missed during the collation process.
- Keep a copy of email and/or other documents sent:
  - Serve as a proof
  - e.g. in case the licensee was suspected failing to render return, the record could serve as a proof that the form has been submitted

# Important points to note

- Request for supplementary information/ clarification:
  - DH may request supplementary information / clarification pertaining to the application/ return during processing, remind applicant/ licensee to provide the requested information within the timeframe to DH.
- Licensee should also keep record of all application documents, including Form 1 and email correspondence (if any), for future reference.
  - e.g for renewal application, reviewing if any change of procedures,
     place of experiment, etc

5. Examples of irregularities found during previous inspection

# Example (1) – Mistaken licence start date

#### The case:

- □ From the Form 6 inspected onsite, it was found that animal experiment was performed before the licence granted
- □ The date of acknowledgement receipt was mistaken as licence start date

#### Contravention:

Performing animal experiment without licence (s3)

#### A person should:

- Not perform animal experiment before a licence is granted
- □ Check the start day of the validity of the licence before performing the experiment
- Perform experiment only within the validity period as stated in licence

# Example (2) – Renewal of licence

#### The case:

- Licensee was found to have performed animal experiment before the licence start day
- Licensee assumed renewal licence was continuous without checking the start date of the renewal licence and performed the experiment

#### Contravention:

■ Performing animal experiment without licence (s3)

- Submit application for the same experiment at least two-month before end-date if aim to have continuous renewal licence
- Not assume renewal licences are always continuous without gap
- Not perform the experiment until renewal licence is granted
- Check the start day of the validity of the licence before performing the experiment

# Example (3) – Place of experiments

#### The case:

- Licensee performed animal experiment at a place not specified in the licence
- Licensee explained that, it was not originally planned to perform the experiment at that location, only after granting of licence, the institute further advised certain procedures had to be performed in other location
- Licensee then performed the experiment at the new location

#### Contravention:

■ Performing experiment not in accordance with the terms of licence (s3)

- □ Check the place of experiment in the existing licence before performing the experiment
- □ Inform DH in writing of the full address(es) of the proposed new place(s) if it is not specified in licence
- Receive a revised licence superseding the existing one if approved by DH
- Perform the experiment at the new place(s) only after receiving the revised licence

# Example (4) – Experimental procedures

#### The case:

- Licensee was found to perform additional procedures on animals which were not included in the licence
- Licensee explained that there was a change of laboratory protocol and therefore the procedures were performed

#### Contravention:

Performing experiment not in accordance with the terms of licence (s3)

- Check the information on the application submitted, and the conditions as specified in the respective licence before starting any new procedures
- Submit a new application if there are updates of the procedures
- Perform the procedures after the new licence is granted

# Example (5) – Sacrificing methods

#### The case:

- Licensee was found to use a method for sacrificing the animals which was specified in the licence
- Licensee explained that he was not aware that he did not choose that method during application

#### Contravention:

 Performing experiment not in accordance with the terms of licence (s3)

- Check the information on the application submitted, and the conditions as specified in the respective licence before performing the experiment
- Submit a new application if there are changes of the experimental procedures
- Perform the procedures after the new licence is granted

# Example (6) – Rendering return

#### The case:

- Licensee was found to have conducted experiment but failed to submit return for previous year
- Licensee explained that a lab manager was responsible for collating and submitting the Form 7 for him
- Upon checking of the record, the respective Form 7 was not attached in the email sent to DH by the lab manager


#### Contravention:

Failing to render returns (s12)

- Be **personally accountable** for failure to submit return on time
- Observe the licensing conditions
- Ensure relevant forms are properly completed and submitted according to the Ordinance

# To avoid non-compliance

A common cause of non-compliance is that the licensee did not check the licence(s) and conditions.



Do not perform the experiment until you have checked your licence(s) and conditions; or received your new licence to cover that procedures / locations.

Seek DH advice if variation of licence or application of new licence is required before conducting experiments not specified in the licence. Take particular care if you hold more than one licence to ensure that the types and places of experiment are covered in the respective licence(s).

#### Notes to licensees


- Licensees are personally accountable for:
  - keeping experiment records;
  - submitting returns on time;
  - observing the licensing conditions; and
  - performing experiments when valid endorsement or permit is otherwise required.
- Licensee should update DH as soon as possible for:
  - any change of contact information; or
  - render return when no more plan to conduct experiment (e.g. leaving corresponding institution).
